Learning Objectives:

von Reyn Fellowship: In the research setting, medical students will

- Learn methods of clinical research that may include the design of a study, data collection and data analysis/validation. Students may participate in an on-going study and/or conduct a study of their own design.
- Become familiar with HIV and TB research studies being conducted by Dartmouth and MUHAS colleagues.
- Learn how a GCP-trial (a trial complaint with Good Clinical Practices) is conducted.

Strickler Fellowship: On the inpatient wards, medical students will

• Participate in the diagnosis, care, and treatment of patients with communicable and noncommunicable diseases at a national tertiary care facility in Tanzania.

- Identify the social determinants impacting the health of individuals admitted to MNH and their families.
- Gain an understanding of the systems issues that impact healthcare delivery in Tanzania and similar resource-limited settings.

Medical students will have primarily inpatient responsibilities. They will assist with the diagnostic evaluation and provision of care to patients on the MNH medical ward (adult or pediatric) under the supervision of inpatient attending physicians

Case Presentation:

 Students are expected to present a case-based lecture on an Internal Medicine subject to MNH students, residents and faculty prior to their departure from Tanzania and to Geisel faculty and students upon their return to the USA. A thank you note and/or general presentation to their respective funding agency may also be required.

Preparation for the Elective

Students are required to meet with the Geisel elective faculty prior to their departure to discuss the details of their research project(s), clinical rotation expectations, elective schedule and discuss travel logistics.

Reading Syllabus

Related articles and other readings will be assigned as appropriate.

Rotation Evaluation:

Von Reyn Fellows will be evaluated by Geisel and DarDar site faculty. Strickler Fellows will be evaluated by MNH faculty.

Funding:

Through support from Geisel's Center for Global Health Equity, a stipend will be provided as follows: \$4000 for 8 weeks; \$3500 for 6-7 weeks, \$3200 for 4-5 weeks (inclusive of airfare, ground transportation to and from final destination, housing, registration fees, and necessary immunizations and malaria prophylaxis).

Orientation:

Students are required to participate in either an online or in-person pre-departure seminar organized through the Center for Global Health Equity. Students are required to visit a travel clinic (Dick's House, DHMC or another of their choice) at least one month prior to departure.

Housing:

Multiple options exist for safe, reasonable, and low-cost housing in Dar es Salaam and this information will be provided to students in our Tanzanian Travel Tips document. Students are expected to make their own housing arrangements and are responsible for covering the cost of their housing.
