“Addressing Health Literacy in Pursuit of Patient-Centered Cancer Screening”



Dr. Gunn is an Assistant Professor at the Dartmouth Institute for Health Policy and Clinical Practice and the Health Equity Liaison to the Community Outreach and Engagement Program of the Norris Cotton Cancer Center. Trained in health services research, her research program uses a community-engaged approach to study risk communication, decision-making, and the utilization of evidence-based cancer care.

This seminar will focus on how health literacy impacts health decision-making and behaviors, highlighting the application of health literacy practices and principles in Dr. Gunn’s work on advancing the provision of equitable cancer screening and prevention services that incorporate personal risk information.



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
