Public health demographer Alka Dev, PhD, MHS, is an assistant professor of The Dartmouth Institute for Health Policy and Clinical Practice. Following her passion for health equity, Dev worked for more than 20 years as a global health professional, serving the healthcare needs of some of the poorest people in the world. Between 2016-2019, she led the establishment of a neonatal ward at a large public hospital in southern Haiti, focusing on improving survival for sick newborns.
