### Dartmouth-led Research Team Receives \$13 Million PCORI Funding Award to Test the Impact of Video on Visit Communication for People with ALS

A research group led by investigators at Dartmouth and the Sean M. Healey & AMG Center for ALS at Massachusetts General Hospital, and including seven other institutions across the U.S., have received a five-year, \$13 million funding award from the Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute (PCORI). 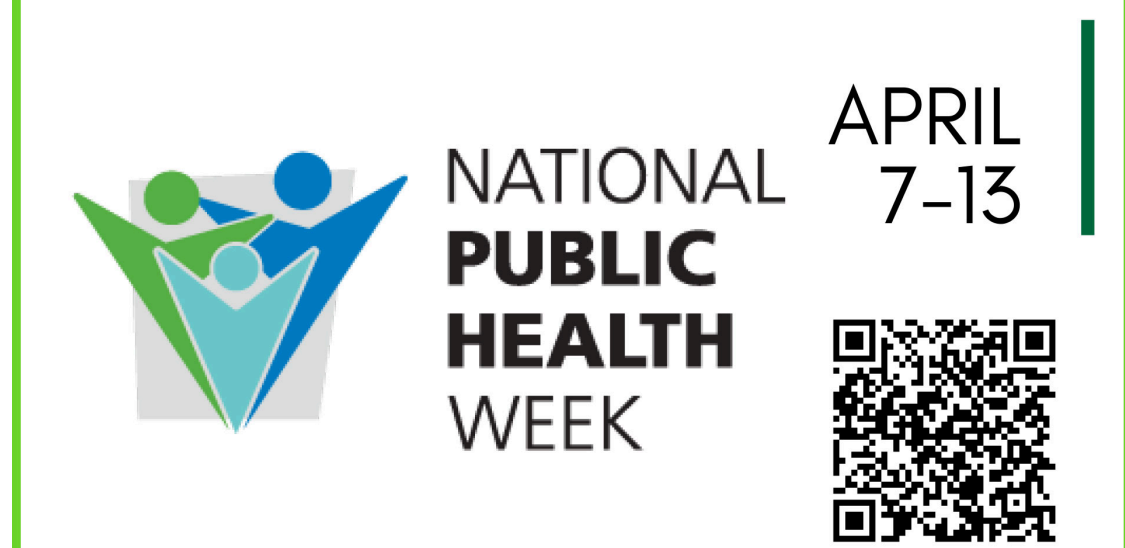

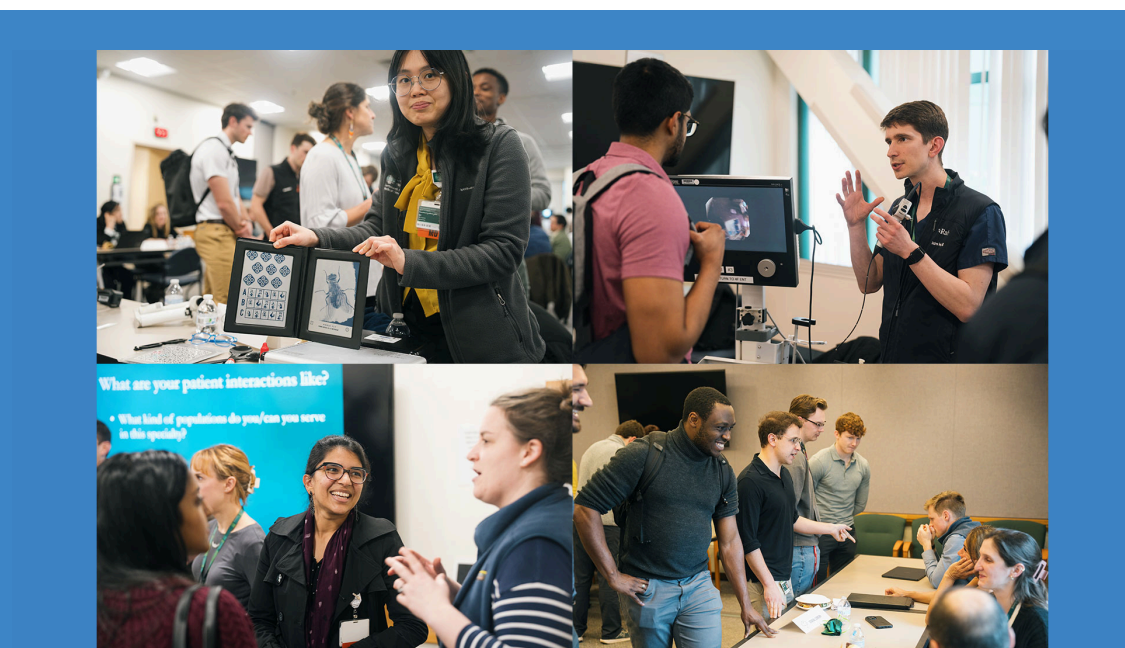
