years of medical school, she completed an MPH at Dartmouth. She is interested in rural health and hopes to practice full-spectrum family medicine in a rural area. In her free time, she likes to run, ski, bike, climb, and play with her dog, Wendell.

 - Current State: Data collection has begun on this project and surveys have been distributed to both clinicians and patients. While turnout has been promising, involvement is greatly appreciated.

 - Current State: The project has made great headway and looks to keep the
 momentum going, clinic sites have received materials for survey distribution,
 and data collection for clinicians has already begun. The patient portion of
 this study will begin in the next few weeks.

 - Current State: Currently the early intervention group, Lamoille Health
 Partners, has received their training in November 2021 and is concluding
 shortly. The late intervention group, Little Rivers Health Care, is awaiting their
 date to begin stress first-aid training and is slated to begin shortly.
- ACEs in Community Practice: Correlating Patient's Distress, Desire to Discuss with their Clinician and with Resilience. PI: Patricia Glowa, MD Study Team: Ardis Olson, MD
 - **Current State:** This study is currently finalizing data analysis and is still in the early stages of manuscript preparation.

Upcoming Research Project Proposals:

- AHRQ Patient Safety Learning Lab proposal- A Collaboration Between Northeastern <u>University and the Dartmouth CO-OP.</u> PI: James Benneyan, Ph.D., Director of Healthcare Systems Engineering Institute, Northeastern University.
 Co-Investigators: Timothy Burdick from Dartmouth, Neil Korsen from MaineHealth, and Connie VanEeghen from the University of Vermont.
 - Current State: Several CO-OP members are working on a grant proposal to fund an AHRQ Patient Safety Learning Lab focused on rural primary care.
 The team anticipates a grant proposal submission in September 2022.

Why is the Dartmouth CO-OP NNE PBRN choosing to theme this month's newsletter around Pride Month? It is simple: LGBTQ+ individuals have yet to be acknowledged as having the same human rights as non-LGBTQ+ individuals and this extends into the healthcare world. LGBTQ+ individuals are currently at the center of several political determinants of health issues, with over 238 bills touching on this introduced in the US in the first three months of 2022.

What is worse, 1 in 8 LGBTQ+ identified individuals, face health discrimination by clinical providers, and 1 in 6 LGBTQ+ adults actively avoid seeking health care due to anticipated discrimination^{1,2}. As a community of clinical representatives, we must ensure that people are not denied healthcare based on sex, gender, race, or religion, which is why we must continue to educate ourselves about the pride community.
