Geisel is partnering with Dartmouth Health on a large national research study of care decisions among older adults with serious illness. The trial, funded by the National Institute on Aging and titled "Advancing Ethical Goals in Society," will enroll more than 12,000 older patients.



Researchers Identify Additional Risk From Tickborne Alpha-Gal Syndrome

A new multi-institute study led by Dartmouth Health and Geisel School of Medicine researchers suggests that alpha-gal syndrome—the tickborne disease that can result in a chronic allergy to meat and animal byproducts—also may complicate certain patients' ability to safely receive a blood plasma or platelet transfusion.



Dartmouth Cancer Center Grand Rounds with Roy Herbst

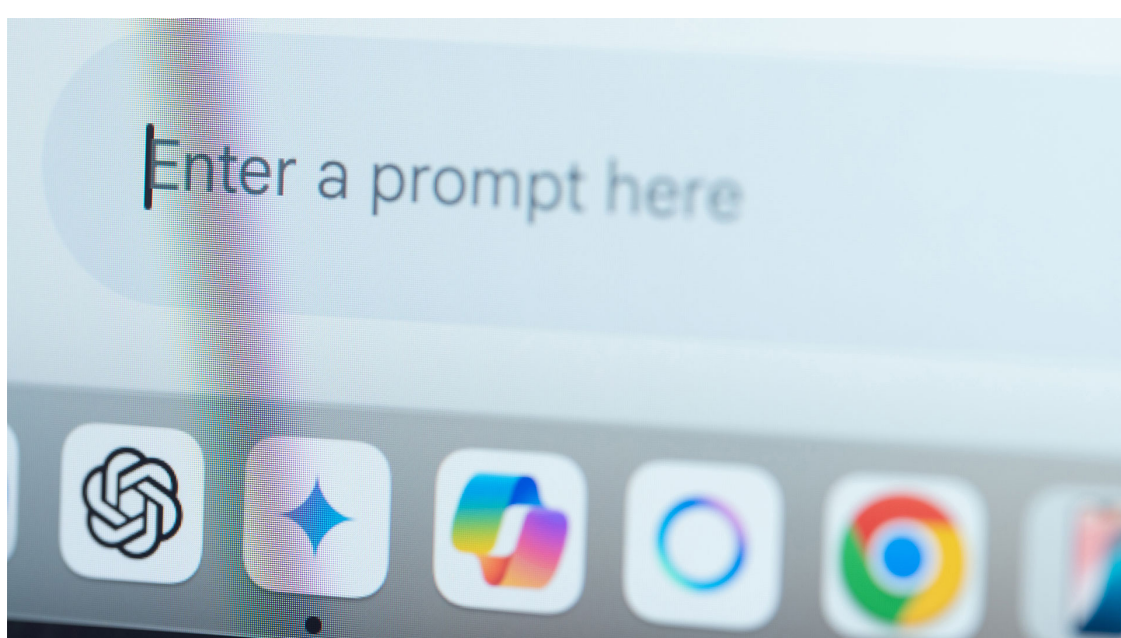
Roy Herbst, the new director of the Dartmouth Cancer Center, will lead the Cancer Center Grand Rounds on Tuesday, Sept. 1 from noon - 1:00 PM in DHMC Auditorium E. Dr. Herbst is internationally recognized as one of the foremost leaders in the development of targeted and immune-based therapies for the treatment of lung cancer. His work throughout the past three decades has significantly advanced the standard of care for patients with lung cancer, greatly enhancing survival and quality of life beyond what was previously thought to be possible. August Medical Student Grand Rounds at DHMC featured two Geisel School of Medicine students who shared their research: a study that tested whether axillary lymph node dissection for breast cancer patients with more than 2 positive sentinel nodes at surgery could safely be omitted, and an examination of whether administering extended-release buprenorphine too deeply may raise concern for injection into muscle, potentially affecting medication absorption and increasing the risk of local complications.
